At Best Food in Town, we serve our loyal customers at curbside. To prevent the spread of the virus, we strive to keep all our employees, customers, friends and acquaintances safe. We check temperatures when people arrive at work. We learn all we can about the virus so that we can inform people in the community about the best ways to keep each other safe and bring this crisis to an end.

Recently, we had the experience of having to shut down our facility for two weeks. Everyone is in peril of this dreaded disease.

So we at BGACDC ask each of you to take this virus seriously and not pretend that taking these precautions interferes with your rights or that you are too strong or fearless to bother with such contrivances as masks. Do not enter public places if you have had a fever of 100.4 or greater in the last two days. If you have a cough, difficulty breathing, a sore throat or loss of taste or smell, *please* do not enter public places. If you've had contact with a person known to be infected with the virus in the previous 14 days, *please* do not enter public places! Wear a mask, wash your hands regularly and keep a hand sanitizer with you.

Be safe yourself but, more importantly, protect your family, friends and neighbors.
